

Dear Neighbors,

As you may be aware, the Town through a generous donation and the work of your Conservation Commission has been developing what we call the "Reservoir Walk." This is a series of trails and improvements from Pond Street to Oak Street around Great Pond and the Upper Reservoir.

The trail from Oak Street will head east up to the property known as the "Fin, Fur and Feather" conservation area. This property is between the Upper Reservoir and North Street abutting streets including Broad and State. The Commission would like to have a discussion with you as to what your vision may be for this Conservation area and to present what our ideas are for improving this area.

The Commission is in the process of making the Town's conservation property more accessible while preserving the unique character of each area, recognizing that these places offer a quiet retreat where residents can enjoy nature and wildlife.
