Avon blasting affects Randolph

Randolph residents near Stoughton Street and Fitch Terrace are affected by the "blasting zone" at the T.L. Edwards site across the town border in Avon. *The blasting has caused structural damage* to walls and basements.

Few Avon residents hear the blasting – but Randolph residential neighborhoods are near there – *hundreds of homes have been damaged* by the repeated blasts and vibrations, which cause sinkholes and cracks in foundations and walls.



The people of Randolph would like to tell the people of Avon – our neighbors – about this issue. Please *sign a new petition to present to the Avon Town Meeting* to be heard by the Avon Select Board and Avon Town Meeting. They have denied our previous two petitions but this one is designed to be impossible to dismiss.

PETITION FOR AVON TOWN MEETING WARRANT ON DAMAGES FROM BLASTING

We, the below-signed residents of the Town of Randolph, hereby request that the Avon Town Meeting of Spring 2025, consider and vote on the following Warrant, which is separately submitted with signatures required from Avon registered voters: To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Select Board to investigate reducing future damage to residents of Randolph whose homes were damaged by the Town-permitted blasting adjacent to the Randolph-Avon border; such as:

- Limiting the size of repeated blasting below the state limit of Richter Scale 2.0
- Limiting the number of repeated blasting to a certain number per hour and per day
- Widening the area required for insurance investigation above the state limit of a half mile
- Empowering an independent "Public Adjustor" to perform inspections and determine causality
